### **Prescribed Fire Training Exchange Planned in October on Bureau of Land Management and State Trust Lands near Peñasco NM, Weather Permitting**

Peñasco, NM – [Taos BLM](#), the [New Mexico State Land Office](#), [The Nature Conservancy's Fire Learning Network](#), and the [Forest Stewards Guild](#) are organizing a prescribed fire training exchange (TRES) to safely return fire to approximately 500 acres of ponderosa pine and piñon-juniper forests state trust and Bureau of Land Management (BLM) lands west of Peñasco, NM. This burn is training new firefighters who will be working alongside highly qualified and experienced firefighters. The TRES also offers advanced training opportunities in a learning environment. Broadcast burning promotes ecological health in frequent fire forests, reduces hazardous fuels thereby protecting nearby communities, and reduces the intensity and size of future wildfires.

Weather permitting, ignitions will begin in early October. The team will assemble beginning October 1. When burning is occurring, smoke may settle in the evenings but should disperse the following day. “This burn is a culmination of work that began over ten years ago in collaboration with the State Land Office and the BLM to improve forest health, protect nearby communities from wildfire, and to protect the Rio Trampas Watershed.” notes Forest Stewards Guild Southwest Director Eytan Krasilovsky. “We have excellent collaborative restoration partners that are once again coming together to learn and burn together.”
