Controlled Burn Complete, 20 acres successfully treated at Cottonwood Gulch in Thoreau NM

Santa Fe, NM –Bluewater Acres Fire Department, <u>Prometheus Fire Consulting</u>, the <u>City of Santa Fe</u>, the <u>Santa Fe National Forest</u>, the Forest Stewards Guild, and <u>The Nature Conservancy's Spanish Language Prescribed Fire Training Exchange</u> successfully and safely returned fire to 20 acres of ponderosa pine forest at <u>Cottonwood Gulch Foundation's</u> property south of Thoreau NM. This training burn is training firefighters from Spanish speaking countries alongside qualified firefighters from New Mexico. Broadcast burning promotes ecological health in frequent fire forests, reduces hazardous fuels thereby protecting nearby communities, and reduces the intensity and size of future wildfires.

There are no ignitions planned for tomorrow. The burn operation is in a holding and monitoring status. Firefighting resources remain onsite at Cottonwood Gulch Foundation's property south of Thoreau NM and will be patrolling the burn area. Bluewater Acres Fire Department will patrol the burn for several days to ensure the fire stays within the control lines. There may be residual smoke over the next few days as fuels in the interior continue to consume. Smoke may settle in the evenings but will disperse the following day.

"This training burn is a unique opportunity to train and learn from ecologically-minded land managers from Spanish speaking countries." notes Forest Stewards Guild Southwest Director Eytan Krasilovsky. "We have excellent collaborative restoration partners that are once again coming together to learn and burn together."
