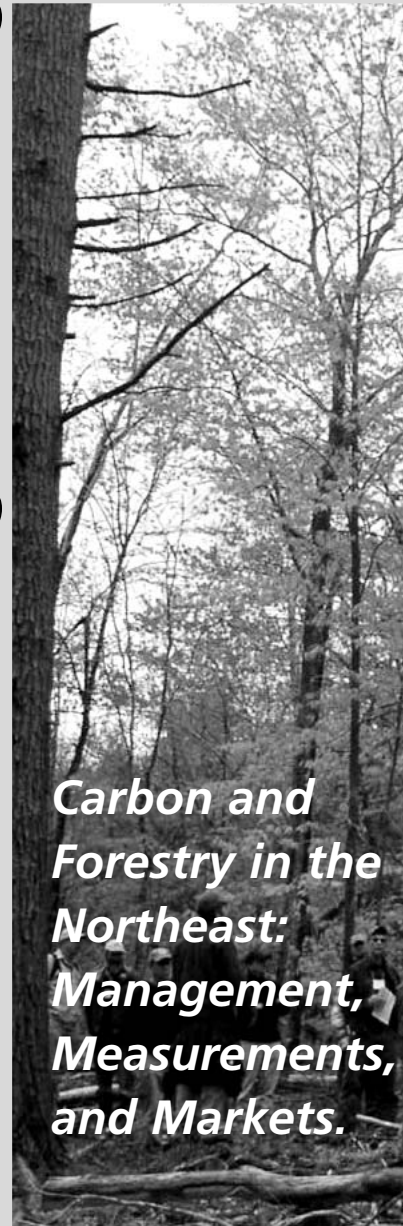

Field activities will use the Galusha Hill Forest in Topsham, Vermont. This 958-acre property is owned and managed by Meadowsend Timberlands and was the site of the 1st Forest Guild New England regional meeting in 2000. The property is FSC certified and will provide opportunities to view and discuss numerous management activities and treatments. In particular, we'll look at how carbon is stored in forests.

Carbon sequestration in soils (Tom Villars, NRCS; Sandy Wilmot VT DFPR) What does carbon look like in soils? How does it change? What do we know about how management affects soil carbon? We'll visit different sites and dig some pits!

Coarse woody material: why should we pay attention and how can we manage it? (Presenter TBA) Last year, we heard about CWM's role as important habitat. What is its role in carbon storage? How do we measure, track, and promote coarse woody material?

Trees and silviculture: a short course in stand dynamics (Presenter TBA) Recent work from Yale on stand dynamics has inspired some foresters to think about stands and "growing space" differently. Are these new ideas or simply a different twist on basic silviculture? Can these ideas help us implement silviculture with more clarity?

Measures and metrics: What should we be monitoring in changing times? A variety of guild members will offer how their field methods are adapting to increasing needs for information.
