

Forest Guild Interest Areas for Members

The Guild organizes working groups periodically to address various issues. As a Guild member, you will have the opportunity to engage in working groups of your choosing. Recently, active working groups have focused on climate change, biomass, model forests, and ecological forestry. By selecting one or more interest areas, you are helping us gauge our members' general areas of interest. Your choices do not limit the working groups you may engage in.

Demonstration – includes model forests, silviculture, professional development forestry education, and extension.

Policy – includes developing recommendations for Guild programs related to forest policy and reviewing or helping to prepare drafts of Guild policy and position statements and publications.

Research – developing recommendations for and involvement in Guild research programs, including applied and participatory forestry research.

Community Forestry – includes community-based forestry, collaborative approaches to forest management, and culturally diverse perspectives on forest management.
